

Food and Faith with Derrick Weston April 14: Derrick Weston joins us from Creation Justice Ministries, an ecumenical ministry based in Washington DC. Following worship, he will lead our conversation around his work with food, faith, and creation care. His book, *The Just Kitchen*, opens us to see the sacred in the daily mundane and to forge connection with the people and the earth around us. His work encourages us to engage in ministry and justice beyond assistance.

Earth Day "Plastic Jesus" April 21: Highlighting Earth Day, we join with Creation Justice Ministries and our PC(USA) denomination focusing on the epidemic of plastic in our daily lives and environment. This year's focus is titled: "Plastic Jesus: Real Faith in a Synthetic World." Facilitated by Rev. Jen, along with members of the faith formation committee, we raise our awareness and reflect about the reality of plastic around us and the choices we can make as individuals and as a faith community.



Matthew 25:31–46 calls all of us to actively engage in the world around us, so our faith comes alive and we wake up to new possibilities. Convicted by this passage, the Presbyterian Church (USA) decided to act boldly and compassionately to see our neighbors through Jesus' eyes and and serve those who are marginalized or in need, by building congregational vitality, dismantling structural racism, and eradicating systemic poverty.

This oratorio depicts and celebrates the creation of the world as narrated in the Book of Genesis. The first performance was in 1799 in Vienna. René Clausen, choral conductor and professor of music at Concordia College in Moorehead, Minnesota, composed "A New Creation" in 1990. The multi-movement cantata is based on familiar scriptures and has become one of the composer's most performed works.
