Notes on Today's Music

Notes on Handel's "Coronation" Anthem No. 4: George Frideric Handel (1685–1759) was appointed court composer by King George I of England in 1726. A year after this appointment, the king was dead and Handel's responsibility was to compose ceremonial music for the crowning of the new monarch. In England, a coronation is a religious ceremony whose festive and solemn aspects are both expressed in music. The result was the writing of four anthems to be included in the service. One or more of these anthems has been performed at every British coronation since 1727.

Anthem No. 4 "Let Thy Hand Be Strengthened" is adapted from Psalm 89 and includes three separate movements. The first, at a fast tempo, is a prayer for the king's strength and exaltation. The second movement prays that the new king will rule with both justice and mercy. The final, more robust movement, is an 'Alleluia' bringing the work to a joyful conclusion.

Notes on Handel's Organ Concerto Op. 4 No. 1 The organ concertos of Handel were the first works of their kind and served as a model for later composers. These were written for a small orchestra and a chamber organ, with no pedal board. Handel would play the organ part himself, often as interludes for his oratorios. These concertos were popular in their day, showcasing Handel's abilities as an organ virtuoso as well as his compositional skill. The Opus 4 Number 1 Concerto, published in 1738, incorporates the typical dialogue between the organ and the chamber orchestra.
