As we journey with the “Weeping Prophet,” we’ll explore how we might lean into the gritty and faithful work of resilience amid darkness. In a world of uncertainty and chaos, trauma and pain, we must get our hands dirty in the hard work of hope. Join us!



Matthew 25:31-46 calls all of us to actively engage in the world around us, so our faith comes alive and we wake up to new possibilities. Convicted by this passage, the Presbyterian Church (USA) decided to act boldly and compassionately to see our neighbors through Jesus’ eyes and and serve those who are marginalized or in need, by building congregational vitality, dismantling structural racism, and eradicating systemic poverty.

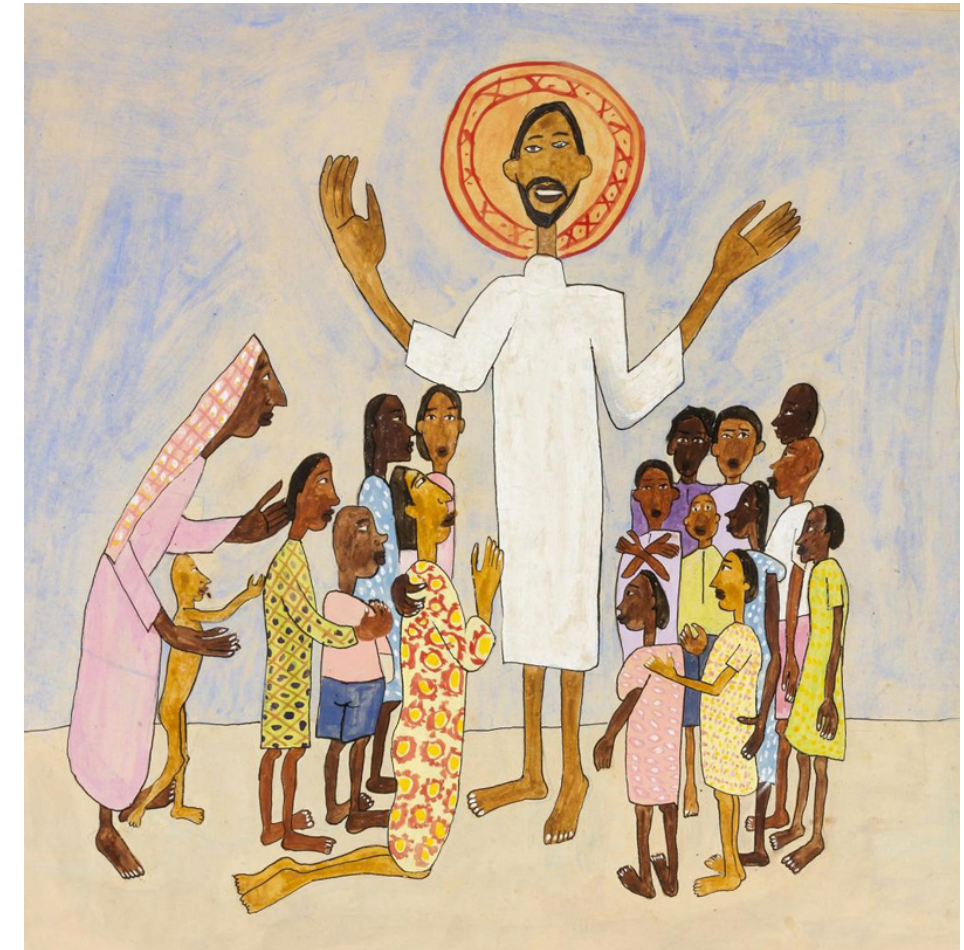
